For Industry Update for Baytex there it is currently business as usual for the areas that I look after.

TransCanada

- NOVA Gas Transmission Ltd. (NGTL), a wholly owned subsidiary of TransCanada PipeLines Limited, is proposing to study options for new natural gas pipeline projects in Alberta as part of expansion of the NGTL System, an extensive network of pipelines that connect Alberta and British Columbia's natural gas resources to key North American markets. This proposed expansion is expected to include pipeline and additional compressor station project work in Clearwater County.
 - o These proposed projects are in addition to the previously announced work at our Nordegg and Clearwater Compressor Station sites as part of our Saddle West Expansion and Clearwater West Expansion projects.
 - o Although pipeline survey has not yet been completed, we are looking at a pipeline loop for our existing Edson Mainline assets in the County that would generally follow the existing corridor, and we will confirm pipeline lengths in the near future.
 - o Maps with information on our proposed study areas for pipeline additions in the County will be distributed electronically for consideration at the next WCS gathering in March, and we are pleased to answer any questions group members have in the meantime.
