Bulletin 2021-38, New Statement of Concern form

The AER has released a new statement of concern (SOC) [form](#). We updated it to make the submission process more user friendly. This new form will help us better understand the concerns of SOC filers and their prior engagement with applicants. SOC filers can now submit the form and supporting documents online, as well as by email or regular mail.

The new form is in HTML format and is embedded on the [AER website](#). As a result, the form can be viewed and submitted on various devices (e.g., cell phone, tablet, laptop etc.). The PDF version of the form has also been updated.

We added more detailed instructions to help filers clearly identify each concern and any documentation they wish to include.

We have included information about additional resources that support engagement between concerned parties and applicants, such as our alternative dispute resolution program.

To enhance the clarity and efficiency of the SOC process, permissions associated with confidentiality and supplemental information are now requested up front, and a mechanism for SOC filers to request permission to file supporting documentation after the SOC filing deadline has been created.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

• Joint Public Information Session

- Rimbey Regional Synergy Group (RRSG) met in September and is planning to hold a public information session early in 2022. Given the continued growth of interest in alternative energy development, and potentials in the central part of the province, the session would focus on what landowners might need to know or consider if approached for renewable energy facilities on their land.
- It is anticipated it would likely be a virtual webinar format type event, as restrictions on gathering don't appear to be ending soon.
- RRSG is wondering if there is opportunity to work together with surrounding synergy groups to put something together for January "ish".
- Pembina Area Synergy (PAS) group is quite interested. They suggested the session could also look at opportunity to pass along successes and learnings of oil & gas industry over the years, as it relates to community and stakeholder relations.
- Would also include a general update on landowner related trends in the renewable energy side of things.
- Darcy from Farmers' Advocate Office (FAO) indicated he would be willing to participate in the session.
- The group (WCS) indicated they are willing to work together with the other groups in putting together a joint session.
- Rick will also be contacting the Central Alberta Synergy (CAS) group that covers the Lacombe/Sylvan Lake/Red Deer area.
- Target date would be mid-later part of January, perhaps early February
- Rick will liaise with Alasdair (CAS), Darcy (FAO), the Canadian Renewable Energy Association, etc. to start pulling a session together.
- Rick will provide more of an update at the November meeting.

• Clearwater Community Crime Watch

- Deb Skeels (President) and Murray Welch (Board Member) provided information about Clearwater Community Crime Watch (CCCW) and the role it plays in the community in dealing with rural crime.
- CCCW is a member of Alberta Provincial Crime Watch Association
- Volunteer association, so no real funding locally. The provincial association does do some fund raising at a provincial level (i.e. Casinos).

- Main role of Crime Watch is community support (eyes and ears in the community).
- Looking to have more industry partners to have more eyes/people on the road for reporting purposes.
- CCCW is looking for an industry member from the synergy group to sit on their board to bring an industry perspective and a better connection with local industry companies.
- There are typically four public meetings/year; six-seven board meetings/year. They try to meet about every two months, evening meetings, generally 6-9 pm.
- Rick can share meeting details/confirmation if it's provided to him. Next meeting is scheduled for Oct. 26 @ County office, but not yet confirmed. Chamber has offered to assist with ZOOM connections etc. for meeting assistance.
- Murray and Deb also shared some information about the Lightcatch app that has come to the attention of CCCW.
- Typically, information is old and the trail is already cold when reported to RCMP and shared through the Crime Watch network. There is a phone app that has been developed to assist with reporting and provide more current information.
- It is designed for reporting in real time.
- If you see something suspicious, report it to police but you could also put it on the app. Can include photo and specific description.
- Has a better chance of information being shared real time and up to date.
- Group asked if there could be a presentation from app developer at the next meeting? Industry reps would like for more information so that they can spread the word internally to their respective companies.
- Rick will follow up to try to arrange getting more information on the app.
