Two well Pad at 04-06-038-07W5 (102/16-12-038-08W5 still to be completed & 102/15-12-038-08W5) Strachan Area.

Two well Pad at 02-34-037-08W5 (100/14 & 15-03-038-08W5 Strachan Area. One well at 06-25-042-05W5 (100/07-28-042-05W5) Pembina field just north of highway 53. Two well Pad at 05-02-040-06W5 (100/01-34-039-06W5 & 100/04-26-039-06W5) Willesden Green area.

Bonavista's first drill into the Duvernay formation is currently underway at 12-23-044-03W5

Discussion Items:

- Fall Information Session
 - The group discussed the potential of holding a public information night on the topic of liability management. There is much that goes on behind the scenes in managing for liability and insolvency issues well before a facility reaches the point of going to the Orphan Well Association. General discussion ensued on reclamation as well.
 - Some discussion occurred regarding industry crime and rural crime in general and how it impacts us all. Murray has been involved in the local Rural Crime Watch and had circulated a couple informational letters to the group. After a thorough discussion the group decided that the topic, while relevant for regular group meetings, was likely not a great fit for a public information night for WCS.
 - The group explored the potential interest in a session focused on actual reclamation activities; looking at how it works and featuring some success stories vs. common myth. Also, the suggestion was made to try to make presentations more visual (pictures / videos) with actual examples and with much less focus on text, graphs and charts.
 - Rick will do some basic follow-up to check for potential programs / projects / organizations / speakers, etc.
